Pool Rules and Regulations/ Code of Conduct

All pool patrons must adhere to the following Rules and Regulations

Rules and Regulations

- The rules and requests made by lifesaving personnel must always be followed.
- Walk; don't run in and around the pool facility.
- Children under eight years old must be accompanied by a parent or responsible person, in a swim suit, at all times, including in the water, on the deck and in the restroom. While in the water, the parent or responsible person must remain within arms reach of the child.
- Children under 12 years of age must be accompanied by an adult person, 16 years of age or older to enter the pool area.
- Children who are not toilet-trained and less than four years old will be allowed in the pool only if they wear a swimsuit diaper or plastic pants and a swim suit. Cloth or disposable diapers are not accepted, and patrons will be asked to leave the pool if the rule is not followed.
- Acceptable swim attire must be worn by patrons on the deck and in the water. Patrons with religious concerns regarding modesty may wear clean, covering garments that do not interfere with their safety in the water. No "cutoffs" may be worn as swim attire in the pool.
- Animals are not allowed in the building or pool area, with the exception of guide dogs. Guide dogs are allowed on deck, but not in the water.
- Persons who appear to be under the influence of alcohol or narcotics will be denied admission.
- No glass items, chewing gum or smoking is permitted anywhere in the facility.
- The use of sunscreen is encouraged all patrons must wait at least 20 minutes before re-entering the water.
- All patrons must shower with soap before entering the pool. Persons with open cuts, sores, bandages, colds, coughs or infected eyes are not permitted in the pool.
- All children and adults who appear to have less than ample swim skills must pass a swim test before entering deep water. Weak or non-swimmers must remain in shallow water no deeper than their chest level.
- No one should engage the lifeguard in unnecessary conversation.
- Diving in water less than nine feet deep, back dives, somersaults, "cannon balls" from the side of the pool or any other unsafe activities are prohibited.
- Lying on the deck close to the edge of the pool where swimmers may trip over sunbathers is dangerous. Sunbathers must lie or sit at least three (3) feet away from the edge of the pool.
- Spitting, spouting or nose-blowing in the pool is strictly prohibited.
- Trash must be properly disposed of in the waste receptacles
- Residents under the age of 16 are not permitted to bring guests to the pool.
- You must wait at least 20 minutes after applying sunscreen or tanning/sun protection before entering the pool.
- Small floating toys, rings, (defined as anything smaller than a kickboard) are allowed in the shallow end of the pool if not detrimental to safety and may be prohibited at the discretion of the lifeguards. Any infant, toddler or child unable to swim must be in direct contact with an adult in the water at all times especially when using flotation devices. No rafts or large flotation devices or rings allowed due to capacity issues. No squirt guns permitted at any time.
- Hard balls such as tennis balls, skate boards or skates or skate shoes of any kind may not be brought into the pool area.

- During regular pool hours, the pool will be cleared every hour for a 15 minute period. Only adults are permitted to swim during this time. Children are not permitted in the pool during adult swim.
- All users of the pool shall be responsible for damage to property of the Association caused by their family and/or guests.
- The lifeguards have complete control over all activities in the pool area and their instructions must be obeyed at all times.
- Failure to observe the pool rules and regulations may result in the offender being asked to leave the pool area for the rest of the day. In addition, pool privileges may be suspended for up to 48 hours by the lifeguards and for longer periods by the pool manager or Board of Directors, for infractions of pool rules and/or regulations.
- All residents and visitors are required to follow the Code of Conduct.
- Dangerous practices are prohibited. Patrons must not run on decks; climb, sit on fences; jump in shallow water (less than 9 feet deep); dunk, push, pull or unnecessarily splash swimmers.
- Emergency procedures must be observed. Swimmers must leave the pool area immediately upon the signal or request of the lifeguard or Pool Manager.
- Foul or abusive language will not be tolerated.
- A patron will be verbally warned for the first offense; the patron will be asked to leave the pool facility if a second offense occurs, if patron refuses to leave Parker Police will be called to escort patron out of facility and privileges will be suspended for the season.

Pool Patron Code of Conduct

For the safety and wellness of all patrons, all patrons while using the pool and recreational facilities must follow the following Code of Conduct:

- Patrons are not to allow anyone to use the ADT pool card that was issued to them. The picture you took will be linked to your card. If patrons allow anyone to use their pool card "other than the person it was issued to" you will lose your pool privileges, your card will be suspended. Each person issued a card must swipe the card when entering the pool.
- Patrons are required to follow the pool rules and regulations set forth by the Association Board of Directors and any directions issued by the Pool Staff and lifeguards.
- Patrons are required to respect the property of Canterbury Crossing and that of other patrons. Patrons (and/or parents/guardians) will assume financial responsibility for any damages caused by their deliberate destruction.
- Patrons should treat all others and themselves with respect. Aggressive, abusive, vulgar or violent language and behavior towards the pool staff is not permitted and will result in immediate revocation of all pool privileges for the remainder of the year.
- Patrons should refrain from rough-housing or obnoxious behavior that would bother and/or offend other patrons.
- Patrons should respect the privacy of others.

Consequences

- Unacceptable behavior will result in consequences to patrons which may include:
- Being asked to leave for the remainder of the day, or period of time based on the offense, in which the violation occurred.
- Payment of any damages
- Denial of future access to pool facility
- Involvement of law enforcement and/or proper authorities.
- Mandatory meeting with pool manager and/or Board of Directors

Lost/Stolen/Destroyed Cards A Replacement Swipe ID Card will be available for \$25.00

Any household found falsely registering or giving access to non-residents will lose pool privileges INDEFINITELY The pool manger and the CCMA office may request further documentation for proof of residency and updated leases as necessary.
